First Aid Response (PHECC)

This is a comprehensive 3 day Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (PHECC) accredited course which covers all the essential aspects of first aid for the workplace or emergency situation occurring in everyday life.

As of the 1st September 2017, the Health & Safety Authority will only recognise First Aid Response for newly qualified first aiders in the workplace. All first aiders who previously held Occupational First Aid Certification up to 31st August 2017 will refresh to First Aid Response when their certificate is due to expire or during the period of their certification.

The First Aid Response course includes Cardiac First Response-Community (CFR-C) level training. Some of the topics covered are CPR, automated external defibrillators (AEDs), choking, recovery position, stroke and administering aspirin for heart attack patients.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Patient Assessment	Recognise and assess the causes and effects of sudden illness and/or injury in a pre-hospital environment and call for emergency medical services.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Incident Procedure	React to such pre-hospital emergencies
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cardiac First Response – Community• Common Medical Emergencies• Injury Management and Shock• Care of the Unconscious Patient• Burns and Electrical Injury Care• Hypothermia and Hyperthermia	Respond in a safe, effective and appropriate manner to such emergencies utilising the First Aid Response skill set
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Information Management• Communications	Record and report actions and interventions taken while responding to and managing such incidents and during handover to emergency medical services.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Well-Being of the First Aid Responder	Retain a professional and caring attitude in their performance as First Aid Responders.

Place on the course are provided on a first come basis. If a course is full additional courses may be scheduled if there is adequate demand. Safety Ireland will at all times ensure equality in our service provision. English is the language that the training in provided in and participants must have a good understanding of the English language, in the case where this is not so participants are permitted to bring an interpreter they may do so but prior notice must be given to Safety Ireland. This course is a

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modular course and each module has a specific timetable. Participants are not encouraged to attend later modules or exam days on alternative course, but we will try to accommodate participants that cannot complete the course due to circumstances beyond their control on an alternative/ later course. Successful candidates can progress to a First Aid Response Instructor certificate as this is the minimum standard for entry to this course.
